Story Swaps on Zoom Etiquette Tips!

- 1. Please don't ask how to change the settings on your device during the meeting we often don't know and it takes up precious time meant for being together. Every device used accessing this Zoom Session has a DIFFERENT way of viewing everyone, seeing chat, making comments on chat, seeing participants, and more. Please learn how your device works with Zoom on your own time, well in advance of joining in the Swap.
- 2. While the Tellers are presenting, please keep yourself MUTED. The room monitor will un-mute everyone after the Teller has finished and comments are welcome.
- 3. <u>If you are doing something other than facing your screen or camera, please turn off your video.</u> You don't want to be seen doing anything other than being attentive! This includes *eating* and *"picking" at things*. And turn off your camera *if you move away* from your computer.
- 4. There may be times we have to turn off all video cameras so that a Teller with a less than ideal internet connection has more bandwidth available to them for their "upstream" feed. You can turn on your video again after the Teller has finished.
- 5. Please note how you look on-screen. If your camera is tilted in such a way that we are looking up your nose, it's not a very nice view for participants. Please position yourself in the best way you can! If you're not wearing pants, turn off the camera before you stand up!
- 6. Please pay attention to what's behind you/your background! We can see it, and if there's a window or bright light behind you, your face is often too dark to see. Either close the blinds & turn off the lights behind you, or add some front lighting so you can be seen.
- 7. Please pay attention to the CHAT button lighting up. It means there's a message from the host or technician which requires your attention. Or it may be a message from another participant directly to you.
- 8. <u>Feel free to show "Jazz Hands"!!</u> Please hold up your hands by your face and wave/shake/wiggle them rather than applaud, as everyone will be muted when the Teller is finished. The host or room monitor will soon un-mute all for constructive comments from the gallery.
- 9. Enjoy and tell others about our Story Swaps!
